 - o Each School gives a "State of School" address
 - o Systems for student success
 - 5 School's: Cascade High School, Everett High School, Evergreen Middle School, Jefferson Elementary School and North Middle School
 - Wellbeing of children: College, Career and Life ready
 - Graduation rate has increased to 96% from 59% in 2005.
 - Dropout rate has decreased to a hand full
